

GRADING SYSTEM

Evaluation of a pupil's work must be done regularly and systematically if there is to be an understanding of his/her progress. Teachers must recognize differences in curricula, classes, and individuals to determine what is expected of each pupil.

Grades shall not be based solely on tests and homework. Teachers shall also evaluate performance in class discussions and individual or group projects. A student's behavior, exemplary or disruptive, shall not affect academic grades received except as it may be part of a class participation evaluation that is made for all students.

Participation in activities outside of scheduled class time may become a requirement for the completion of an elective course and may be evaluated in determining grades for the course.
